Danny Murphy – 21st Sunday of the Year 2016

In the era in which I grew up, it seemed to me that often God was portrayed as angry and annoyed. He seldom smiled and was mostly in a bad mood. If you didn't sin and kept all the rules and regulations...then God love you. If you sinned and DIDN'T keep all the rules and

regulations...then God didn't love you. When you shaped up...God loved you. When you messed up, God didn't love you. Well...if that is who God is, then yes, only a few will be saved. And I surely will NOT be one of them!

My niece Molly lives in California. You have never met her so I can tell you this story and it won't embarrass her. Many years ago I went to visit my sister Kathleen and she asked me to hold her baby daughter, Molly while she went into the kitchen to prepare dinner. No sooner did she leave when Molly had a huge bowel movement. We're talking Number TWO! It smelled so awful, I could hardly breathe! And to make matters worse, she started drooling and spit up all over my shirt!. I was never so happy to see my sister return from the kitchen so I could return Molly to her!
