She immediately invested it, made another \$5000 and went on a trip to Italy where she enjoyed a marvelous time. To a second friend, the rich man gave a gift of \$2000. She immediately invested it, made another \$2000 and went on a trip to Ireland where she enjoyed a marvelous time. To a third friend, the rich man gave a gift of \$1000, but this woman was envious, angry that she had received less than the others. So she buried the gift that he had given. Some of her friends said to her: "While you might not have enough money to go to Italy or Ireland, but \$1000 IS enough money for you to go to Holland and Holland has unique attractions that neither Italy nor Ireland has: windmills, tulips, Rembrandts and much more, why don't you give Holland a try"? But the third woman was adamant NOT to give Holland a try and she kept her gift buried and spent the rest of her life with self-pity as her constant companion; complaining how life is just not fair.
